Yankees 5 Cardinals 1

Johnny O'Malley's inside-the-park homer led the Yankees to a tight victory at Buckeye Field. Ben Miller, Will Brueckner, and Devin Regan also provided run-scoring hits for the bombers. Recent AAA call-up Max Burdock got the Cardinals only hit and Jack Brydon pitched two shutout innings for the Redbirds.

Cubs 6 Red Sox 1

Scotty Fox and Alexie Shurtz each had 3 hits to lead the Cubs. Shurtz drove in 4 runs and Kaj Simonsen, Ryan Leamy, and recent AAA call-up Justin Plummer also contributed hits to the Cubbies cause.
