worse," said Chris Learned, business explained that prior to the Local Control Funding Formula, adult education funds were totally separate from support for high schools. Now, to pay for adult education, the AUHSD would have to take some of the meager fundto go toward adult programs. Adding another dimension to the unpleasant financial situation is the voter approved and recently completed substantial multi-million dollar renovation of Del Valle.

In 2008, voters in the AUHSD approved Measure E, a \$93 million facilities bond to continue the community's investment in quality school facilities at its four high schools -Acalanes, Campolindo, Miramonte Del Valle, each of Lamorinda's three and Las Lomas – as well as the district office and the Del Valle Educational Center that includes Acalanes Lafayette has Camp Awesome for Contract Independent Study, built in kids, soccer, tiny tots, after-school 1958. A whopping \$24 million of that total was spent to rebuild the crumbling Del Valle campus.
