



Brueckner, a former Acalanes softball coach and father of collegiate softball player Alyssa Brueckner, has taken a strong interest in Alexie's playing, and says she has the potential to be one of the "top five" softball players in Lamorinda.

Says Brueckner: "Softball is a quicker game... it's more about strategy. In softball one little mistake and the person is safe at first, instead of out."

With Alexie's potential to excel as a softball player, Brueckner has encouraged her to make the move soon.

This season, though, look for Alexie at Lafayette's Buckeye Field. She'll probably be rounding third base, smiling as she runs towards the rest of her team who gather at home plate, waiting to congratulate her for yet another homerun.
