



Exploring a Custom Wine Cellar

bout seven years ago when Vickie and Jeff Martir were remodeling their Moraga home, they thought the odd space that lead to their basement and a furnace could be converted into a wine cellar. By rearranging the area, and cannibalizing some subterranean space under a stairwell, they were able to create a custom wine cellai that officially accommodates 1,200 bottles. The ever-growing collection has spilled over into an adjacent tasting area; Jef jokes, "we need to start drinking more."

They wanted to give the space an old world look, reflected in the dark wood and wrought iron leaf details. A cooling system keeps the cellar at a constant temperature of 56 degrees just right for storage. A variety of decanters and a lovely antique cabinet, purchased locally, along with overflow wine bottles and a sink round out the space.

Jeff is the primary wine enthusiast of the family, having been interested in wine for the past twenty years. Son Tylei shares his fascination; he's a wine and viticulture major with a concentration in enology at Cal Poly San Luis Obispo; he hopes to go into the wine business.
