This film festival has grown from humble beginnings in 1995, "We started with one weekend at one venue," said Riva Gambert, Director of Community Programs for the Jewish Community Foundation, "Now we're up to four venues and more than fifty screenings." Organizers are calling it the largest Jewish cultural event in the Contra Cost/Tri-Valley

Independent Film Festival at pluralism. Venues include CineArts in Pleasant Hill, the Jewish Creek, the Vine Cinema in Livermore – and for the first time ever the Orinda Theatre.
