pears. "We collected 500 pounds today and just as much last week," said Nooshy Mobasher, a volunteer with Urban Farmers, "we also sent 350 pounds of pears that had fallen on the floor to the Lindsay Wildlife Museum—the 'residents' ate all of them within the week."

Pears are picked green so wildlife does not get at it before humans do, and because it is the best way to get excellent fruit. "Unlike most other fruits, pears ripen from the inside hard and then ripening it off the tree for one to two weeks."
