After a scoreless first quarter, the Dons started the onslaught with a short run to the end zone with 9:35 left in the second quarter to go up 7-0. The Cougars then went on to score two more second quarter touchdowns courtesy of junior quarterback Brett Stephens and senior wide receiver Karl Thornton, making it 21-0 at the half.

Campolindo would continue to punish the Dons in the second half with touchdowns from senior running backs Connor Rosenbaum and Reiner Ebarle before Acalanes was able to score behind senior running back Joseph Drever iust before time ran out. The win was the Cougars' fifth blowout of the season, which includes a 37-7 win over Moreau Catholic, a 49-7 win over Ygnacio Valley, and a 55-20 win over St. Patrick/St. Vincent.

Macy attributes health as one of the main reasons his team, who faces Dublin (4-1, 1-0) for their homecoming game on Friday, October 14th, is performing well.

"We're sort of thin everywhere, we're a small team, but we're keeping people healthy, and we didn't know where we'd be this far into the year," he said. "Kids are finding their roles and things are starting to work for everybody."




Miramonte travels to Campolindo to take on the Cougars on October 21 at 7:00 p.m. in the final Lamorinda rivalry match of the regular season.
