During the Talent Search, advanced young learners take abovegrade level tests designed for older students as a means of gaining insight into their abilities. Seventh and eighth graders take the SAT or ACT-the same tests used for college admisgraders take the School and College Ability Test, an above-level test scaled for younger students.


